## DAVID HOCKNEY ART TRIP

The Year 10 Art pupils were given an excellent opportunity to visit and see the David Hockney exhibition at the Tate Britain on the London South Bank.

The very eager artists left Corby at 9am with Mrs Evans and Mrs Bonner, who were more excited than the pupils! The Tate holds some of the world's masterpieces from Turner to Rossetti, but the star of the show for pupils, was David Hockney - one of the most influential artists of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The pupils

had a fantastic time and were a real credit to Kingswood. Indeed, the teachers were stopped by other visitors in the gallery who commented on how some of our pupils; particularly Megan, Daisy, Izzy and Ellie were very mature and extremely insightful with their observations about Hockney's art.

A really fantastic day although blighted with some drama when Rhys had to be rescued from the toilets!!

## Inter Academy Football Festival

On Tuesday 14 March, we hosted the first Inter Academy Football Festival for eight secondary Academies sponsored by the Greenwood Academies Trust (GAT).

Over 160 pupils from the City of Peterborough Academy, the Nottingham Academy, the Nottingham Girls' Academy, the Skegness Academy, the Weston Favell Academy, the Stanground Academy, the Houghton Regis Academy and the Kingswood Secondary Academy took part in the Festival. Each Academy put forward a total of 20 Year 8 boys and girls.



The festival was supported by Kathryn Evans, a former competitive swimmer who represented Great Britain in the Olympic Games (2000 and 2004). Kathryn is currently overseeing the development of Girls' Football for the Youth Sport Trust and is already working alongside PE teams across the Trust to develop girls' character through football. In addition, two players from Leicester City Women's Football Club attended the festival. The two players took the time to talk to many of the pupils taking part and were a huge inspiration to the girls.

## ENGLISH MASTERCLASS

On Monday, the English Department delivered a GCSE masterclass for Year 11, based on their mock exams. The focus was on how pupils could 'add value' to their responses and understand what they need to do to get to their target grade and beyond. Monday's session concentrated on English Language Paper 1, offering valuable insights into what examiners are looking for with each question and offering simple steps to take the fear out of the exam itself. This work will be continued with their class teachers and the pupils were all given handouts which they can use in class or as part of their revision at home.

The top tips to take away:

1. Time management.
2. Keep to the focus of the question.
3. Use evidence but remember to explain the effect.
4. Focus on the 'how?' and 'why?' not the 'what?'
5. Show you know there is a writer behind the text.
6. Be confident - express yourself; have an opinion.

## SQUID - CASHLESS CATERING



Cashless catering - We have now fully installed our Squid system that allows parents to charge their child's cashless catering account from home. During the recent trial period we have seen many parents take up this option and most have stated how easy and straight forward it is to use.

We are now at the point (1 Apr 17) when we intend to reduce from three cash top up points to one, which means that it is far more efficient for parents to charge their child's account via the internet than it is for their child to queue up to charge the account with cash.

Every parent has been provided with the log on details and issued with a three digit PIN.
